Client Bill of Rights

Consumers of psychotherapy services offered by Oregon licensees have the right to:

- 1) expect that the licensee has met minimal requirements of education and experience as established by law;
- 2) examine public records maintained by the Board of Counselors and Therapists, and to have the Board confirm credentials of licensee;
- 3) obtain a copy of the state Code of Ethics;
- 4) report complaints to the Board;
- 5) be informed of the cost of professional services before receiving those services;
- 6) privacy, as defined by Oregon rule and law. The exceptions to confidentiality of information obtained in the course of services include the following: reporting suspected child abuse; reporting imminent danger to the client or others; licensee consultation and supervision; reporting information required in court proceedings or by client's insurance company or other relevant agencies; and defense of claims brought by client against licensee.
- 7) be free from being the object of discrimination on the basis of race, religion, gender, sexual orientation or other unlawful category while receiving service.
